Re: Cleveland Heights Municipal Court's Annual Report for 2008

The Cleveland Heights Municipal Court continues to place a premium on providing efficient and courteous delivery of quality service to all persons who appear before the court. In addition, we have continued to improve courtroom security and collection procedures by improved diligence in these areas. In this, the court's 2008 Annual Report, I would like to bring to your attention the following matters:

This year the court remitted over \$2,080,121 of revenue from all divisions to the City of Cleveland Heights. It should be noted that this years remittances are approximately \$306,650 more than the 2007 remittances of funds to the city. The increase in overall remittances to the City of Cleveland Heights are attributable primarily to the increase in traffic cases handled by the court and improved collection procedures.

In 2007, the number of traffic cases handled by the court was 14,833. In 2008 that number increased to 17,785 cases processed. The trend of increasing numbers of charges for persons driving under suspension or without valid drivers licenses has resumed. In 2007 there were 1,977 such cases. In 2008 that number increased to 3,268. Similarly, the number of speeding charges processed through the court in 2007 was 7,888. In 2008 that number increased to 10,050.

In the criminal division, there was a decrease in the number of cases heard by the court to 3,047 including 146 cases prosecuting persons for failing to file income tax returns during previous years. Our probation department continues its excellent work of supervising over 1,556 probationers. As a sentencing alternative in limited cases the Court has permitted home detention in lieu of jail time. Defendants wearing ankle bracelets pay a fee for the monitoring service.

The court continues to make significant progress in its efforts to collect monies owed to the court. The court's strict enforcement of the policy that "all fines and costs are due on the day imposed", has resulted in an improved collection rate of fines imposed. The Court continues to refer some persons who are unable to pay fines and costs imposed to the Public Works Dept. of the City to perform community service for the city. During 2008 1,290 hrs of service was performed at a savings to the city of \$23,621 in labor costs. Other nonprofit agencies in the city have benefitted from similar referrals. We will continue to look for additional ways to further improve in these categories.

The Court has cooperated with the City in its efforts to reduce costs by not filling vacant positions and otherwise reducing operating costs. Our employees remain committed to providing excellent service and improving efficiencies in the operation of the Cleveland Heights Municipal Court.

Community Service/Public Works Referrals 2008

- ➤ As of December 16, 2008, the Court has referred 93 defendants to the Cleveland Heights Public Works Department. These individuals have performed a total of 1,290 hours of service and in turn have saved Public Works/the City approximately \$23,621 in labor cost.
- ➤ In 2006 when the endeavor began, total referrals of 34 defendants with a total of 776 hours were worked which in turn saved the City \$13,960.
- CCS Court Community Service is a sentencing alternative program that has been in operation over 20 years. CCS operates supervised community service work crews that provide assistance to not-for-profit and governmental agencies throughout Cuyahoga County.

Alternative to Jail/Home Detention Referrals:

➤ In 2008 the total referrals made for Home Detention has been 50 defendants each providing registration fees averaging \$25.00 for a total of \$1162 collected.
