Cleveland Heights Municipal Court's Annual Report for 2010



The Cleveland Heights Municipal Court continues to place a premium on providing efficient and courteous delivery of quality service to all persons who appear before the court. In addition, we have continued to improve courtroom security and collection procedures by improved diligence in these areas. In this, the court's 2010 Annual Report, I would like to bring to your attention the following matters:

- This year the court remitted over \$2,285,559.95 of revenues from all divisions to the City of Cleveland Heights. It should be noted that this year's remittances are about \$228,000 less than the 2009 remittances of funds to the city. The decrease in overall remittances to the city is attributable primarily to the decrease in traffic cases handled by the court during the year.
- In 2009 the number of traffic cases handled by the court was 24,029, in 2010 that number decreased to 21,761 cases processed, about 10.4% fewer cases. The trend of increasing numbers of charges for persons driving under suspension or without valid driver's licenses has leveled off. In 2009 there were 6006 such cases. In 2010 that number slightly increased to 6079. Similarly, the number of speeding charges processed through the court in 2009 was 12,549. In 2010 that number decreased to 9,652, a 23% decrease.
- In the criminal division, there were 2919 cases heard, about 200 fewer than in 2009. Our probation department continues its excellent work of supervising over 1820 probationers in addition to over 975 DUS offenders. The court has continued to utilize home detention as a sentencing alternative in lieu of jail in some cases. Defendants wear ankle bracelets and pay a fee for the GPS service that monitors there confinement. The total savings to the city in jail expenditures as a result is approximately \$43,350.00
- The court continues to be diligent in its efforts to collect monies owed to the city. In some cases the court permits debtors to perform community services in lieu of paying fines and costs due. Many perform services for the city through its Public Works Department. This year 67 persons completed work assignments through the department totaling 2,944 hours of service, saving the department \$54,022.00 in labor costs. Other non-profit agencies in the city have benefitted from similar referrals. We will continue to look for ways to further improve in these categories.
- The court is in the process of upgrading the use of technology in the courtrooms and clerk's office.
 By year's end we will have available flat screen viewing of exhibits, documents and messaging available to parties, jurors and witnesses. In addition we expect to implement the paperless storage of files and documents this year all at no additional cost to the city.

Our employees remain committed to providing excellent service and improving efficiencies in the operation of the Cleveland Heights Municipal Court.

Community Service/Public Works Referrals 2010

▶ Between January 1, 2010 and December 31, 2010, the Court has referred 67 individuals to Cleveland Heights Public Works Department who successfully completed their assigned community service hours. These individuals performed a total of 2,944 hours of service and in turn saved the Public Works Department approximately \$54,022 in labor costs.

In comparison, between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2009, the court referred 60 individuals to Cleveland Heights Public Works Department to perform community service hours. These individuals performed a total of 1,233 hours of service and in turn saved the Public Works Department approximately \$22,625 in labor cost.

Alternative to Jail/Home Detention Referrals:

➤ In 2010 seventy (70) defendants were referred to Global Tracking to complete our Home Detention Program. Each defendant paid a registration fee of \$25.00, total collected, \$1,750.00 to be used towards future probation programming. There also was a total savings \$43,350.00 of jail expenditures for the City of Cleveland Heights.
